

5 LITTLE TADPOLES BOOK

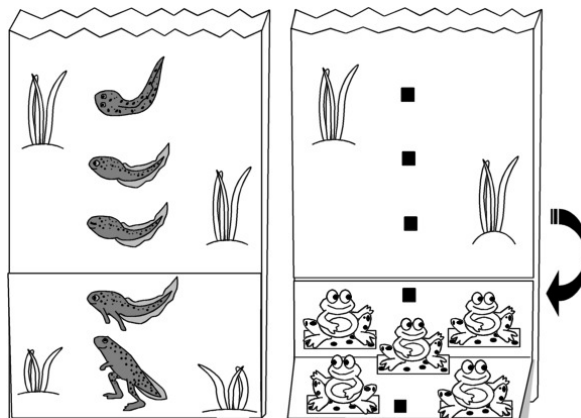

Ordinal numbers

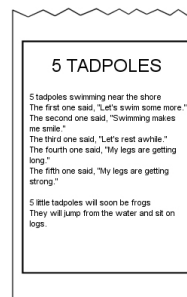
What you will need:

5 Tadpoles patterns and poem.
Grocery paper bag
Glue
Scissors
Blue paint
White cardstock paper
Velcro®



How to make it:

Print or copy the 5 Tadpoles patterns on white cardstock.
Copy the tadpoles poem on the next page (poem is not on the CD).
Cut out the tadpoles and frogs on logs. Laminate for durability.
Paint one entire side of the paper bag **with the flap** blue. Paint some greenery to make a pond scene.
Glue the poem to the opposite side of the paper bag (the side without the flap) see illustration.
On the blue side use the Velcro to attach the tadpoles in a liner fashion down the bag from top to bottom (not scattered).
Open the paper bag's flap and glue the 5 frogs inside the flap. Use a small piece of Velcro to keep the flap closed.



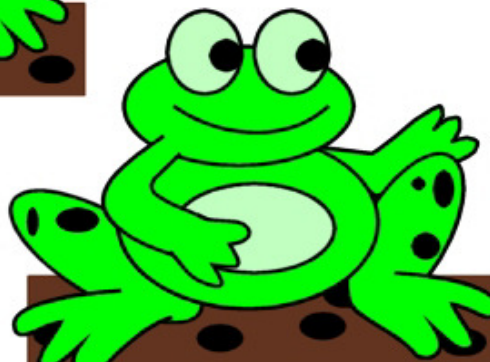
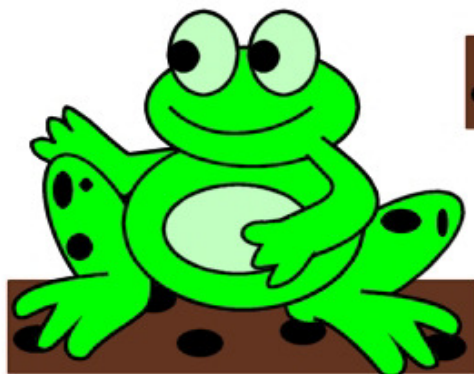
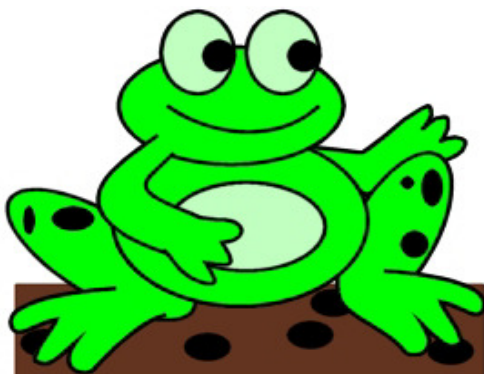
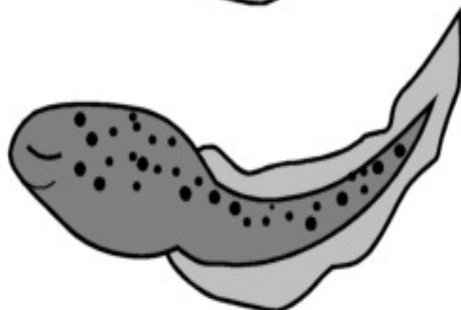
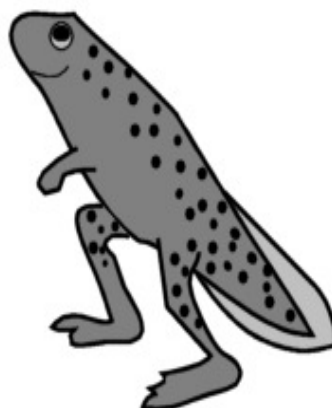
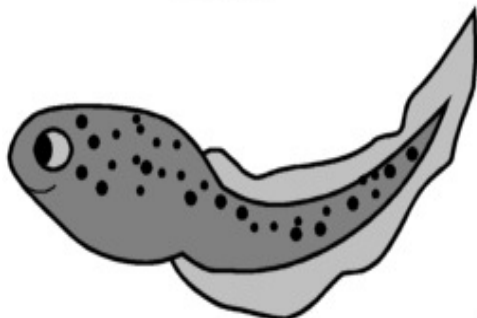
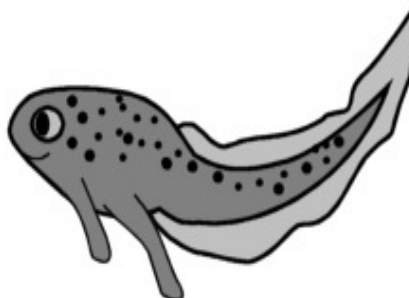
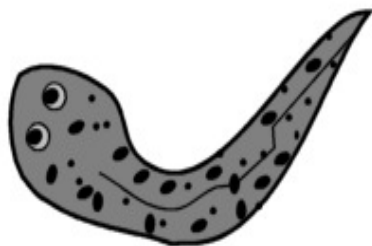
What to do:

As you recite the poem "5 Tadpoles" take off one tadpole and drop it into the paper bag (pond).
When all 5 tadpoles have been taken off and you get to the part of the poem "5 tadpoles will soon be frogs" open the flap to reveal the frogs.

Do more:

Let each child make their own 5 Tadpoles book to take home and read to their families.
